Gilbert headlined Signature Luncheon



Keynote speaker Melissa Gilbert called herself "the poster child for how not to walk a child through grief" while praising Tidewell Hospice's Blue Butterfly Family Grief Center during the 11th Annual Tidewell Hospice Signature Luncheon on Feb. 20, 2020. Melissa lost her father, actor Paul Giilbert, at age 11.

"All of that grief and all that pain came out in the wrong places. It came out in putting myself in dangerous situations ... and acting out inappropriately," said Melissa, an actor and director beloved for her role as Laura Ingalls Wilder in the hit TV show "Little House on the Prairie." "I'm so extraordinarily grateful that we live in a time when there are organizations like Tidewell who really set a template for how to deal with children in grief."

The Signature Luncheon, Tidewell's premier fundraiser, raised more than \$1.5 million during its first 10 years to support programs and services that benefit patients and families. Tidewell celebrated its 40th anniversary year and thanked generous donors while putting a spotlight on the programs and services those donors make possible. Chief Philanthropy Officer Debbie Mason showcased Blue Butterfly with a video during her remarks.

On July 1, the Tidewell Hospice Philanthropy Department transformed into the Tidewell Foundation.

Yet, what is the Tidewell Foundation and what does it mean to our donors and the programs and services their philanthropic giving supports?

What is the Tidewell Foundation?

The Tidewell Foundation is a separate 501(c)(3) notfor-profit with the sole mission of supporting Tidewell and its related companies in meeting our not-for-profit mission of care.

Tidewell named EVP/Chief Philanthropy Officer Debbie Mason, CFRE, a veteran foundation/nonprofit CEO, development and communications professional, to serve as the Tidewell Foundation President. The Foundation Vice President is Marlo Turner, CFRE, a noted philanthropy professional who most recently served as Senior Vice President of a local community foundation. The philanthropy staff will join Debbie in the Tidewell Foundation. can better position our hospice for increasing its fundraising capabilities and simplify the messages of how meaningful and necessary philanthropic support is to execute our mission.

The Tidewell Foundation demonstrates Tidewell's never-ending commitment to providing a continuum of health care services to the four-county area we serve. Donor support funds our innovative programs such as Nurse Residency, Tidewell Honor Veterans program, Blue Butterfly Family Grief Centers and more.

Last year more than \$4 million in charitable support was provided by Tidewell to patients, families and community members. That included charity care, grief services, Blue Butterfly Family Grief Center, and complementary services.

Tremendous response from donors powers care during COVID-19

When the COVID-19 pandemic began, Tidewell Hospice was faced with a tremendous need for additional funding, personal protective equipment (PPE), and ways to modify services to care for patients safely and make it possible for our front-line workers to do their jobs.

Our community rose to the challenge. You have donated thousands of masks, in addition to handsewing masks and gowns to protect our colleagues and patients. You have given generously to support the extra staff needed to care for these patients, sent meals to our front-line workers, made it possible to purchase additional PPE and medical equipment through your support and even supported our need for childcare for our clinical colleagues.

Local community foundations also provided ways for Tidewell to continue to serve patients. And, we are grateful to many individual donors who offered financial support and in-kind donations of PPE and other supplies.

We are blown away by the generosity Tidewell Hospice experienced during the 2020 Giving Challenge presented by The Community Foundation of Sarasota County! Thank you!

The COVID-19 pandemic has created additional challenges for all of us, including our patients, colleagues and families. However, it has not stopped the generosity of Tidewell's community of donors with nearly 700 people coming together to raise more than \$107,000 during the 2020 Giving Challenge.

Our original goal was to raise \$16,000 to provide virtual reality headsets to each hospice house allowing those isolated due to the pandemic the opportunity to connect with loved ones. The additional funds raised will allow us to continue to modify our care for patients during COVID-19, providing additional personal protective equipment, charity care services and clinical colleagues to care for those in need.

Tidewell's Music Therapist finds new ways to reach community

Along with the fear and uncertainty surrounding COVID-19, social isolation has been identified as a growing threat to our well-being, especially for our hospice patients.

Visitation restrictions at local long-term care and assisted-living facilities have separated many seniors from the people closest to them. Additionally, at Tidewell we've had to restrict visitors at our hospice houses for the safety of patients, colleagues and families. However, we've been finding ways to help both patients, their loved ones and community members make the best of the situation, with the resources and programs we have. Introducing Michael Russo, Tidewell's Music Therapist. Typically, Michael can visit patients in their homes, long-term care facilities and our hospice houses to provide music therapy. His work and time spent with patients and their families, provides moments of comfort, peace and lowers pain and anxiety levels during their care. With COVID-19, Michael modified the way he provides care. At times, he is able to play music through windows at longterm care facilities, providing "concerts" not only for patients, but many in the facility who aren't in Tidewell's care. Additionally, to give our community bright spots of joy, comfort and connection, Tidewell offered sing-along music therapy sessions with Michael on our Facebook page. But I had never had a personal Tidewell experience until 2010 when my mother was diagnosed with terminal lung cancer," shared Jan. The level of care, concern, support, and comfort we received as a family is something that can't easily be put into words. My mother and I were extremely close and shared many wonderful times together, but the last 5 months of her life were some of the very best and is something I will always treasure, thanks to Tidewell."

Tidewell offers Hope Line for COVID-19 support



During this time of fear and uncertainty, Tidewell Hospice Social Workers, Chaplains and Grief Counselors are using their unique skills to offer support through the Community Hope Line. This

24/7 service is open to all residents of our four-county service area, whether or not they have a previous relationship with Tidewell.

Services available for callers through the Community Hope Line:

- Grief Support: No one needs to face this pandemic alone. Grief specialists are available to provide grief education and emotional support. Supported 100 percent by donors, our grief services are available support callers over the phone or via a Zoom video conferencing session, free of charge.
- Spiritual Support: Regardless of where a caller is or what his or her background may be, the Hope Line offers the opportunity to speak to a chaplain. The chaplains at Tidewell are all nondenominational, ordained and clinically trained to

walk with you wherever you are on your journey.

 Social Support: Social workers at Tidewell see themselves as problem solvers. The coronavirus and the resulting stay-at-home order have caused people to lose jobs, face financial problems, experience childcare concerns and suffer shortages of certain necessities. Though they cannot provide direct financial support, Tidewell social workers can connect callers with community resources available to help them navigate this new normal.

This is not a crisis hotline but a "hope" line for people who need help dealing with today's challenges. For psychiatric or medical emergencies, people should call 911.
