- 91 bath towels and numerous other pillows, blankets, etc.


We also received more than \$4,000 in donations to purchase linens for Tidewell Hospice patients in need.

The patient was also using a stuffed animal as a pillow. With donations made during the Linen Drive, we provided the patient with new bedsheets and pillows. Now, the patient is much more comfortable. His care team can also elevate his feet to decrease edema and to prevent pressure ulcers on his heels. When asked how the family liked the sheets at a recent visit, they could not stop saying thank you."

# Tidewell Foundation brings bright beginnings in difficult times



Edgar had been battling cancer for close to a decade when he met Karina in January of 2020. He was feeling strong, and he was a fighter: Only 20, young and in love.

By December, he experienced a rapid decline in his health. No longer able to walk, he decided to enter Tidewell's care with his family's full support. While at Tidewell, although Edgar was now homebound, he told his care team that he and Karina still dreamed about getting married.

Knowing Edgar was financially struggling, his social worker Rachael Edwards reached out to the Tidewell Foundation's Wishes Fund for help making Edgar and Karina's wedding dream a reality. The Tidewell Foundation worked with Edgar's care team to prepare a special ceremony for Edgar and Karina on New Year's Eve. Through the Wishes Fund, they provided the food, cake, and a notary. Tidewell music therapist

Jasmine Ridge also attended, and she provided the music at the wedding.

To provide Edgar and Karina with a beautiful commemoration of their wedding, the Foundation team contacted local wedding photographer Tara Tomlinson. The couple's story touched Tara, whose mom was a hospice nurse and whose dad passed in Tidewell's care, and Tara decided to donate her services to memorialize this special day.

Edgar had the chance to see his dream of marriage come to life, all thanks to our generous donors. With donors' support, the Tidewell Foundation broadens the definition of hospice care to ensure that our patients live rich, full lives. When we help a patient like Edgar realize his dreams, we foster joy and love that radiates out to touch the lives of friends and families. By working together to change one life at a time, we can lift the entire community.



# **Meet the Tidewell Foundation Board of Trustees**

Judy Berlow started volunteering with Tidewell Hospice and the Tidewell Foundation through getting to know the organization when her husband, Dr. Michael Berlow, was receiving Tidewell Hospice's care.

Judy, Michael and their two daughters were cared for by Tidewell Hospice through family anticipatory grief counseling, palliative and hospice care over the course of several years of Dr. Berlow's final health journey. Since his passing, Judy has gotten more involved by serving on the philanthropy committee, prior to becoming a founding Tidewell Foundation board member.

In addition to her service as a Foundation board member, Judy also serves on the Tidewell Foundation's Signature Luncheon committee, the annual fundraiser for the Tidewell Foundation. An active member of the Lakewood Ranch Rotary Club's Books For Kids program, Judy believes giving back to the community is an important gift in her life.

Judy describes her experience with Tidewell by saying, "My two daughters and I often comment that we are so thankful that we found Tidewell and received the superior care that we did. Tidewell's care was as important to the girls and me, as it was to Michael. And after Michael passed, Tidewell's grief support helped us accept, cope and find peace."

When asked what motivates her to serve on the Tidewell Foundation board, Judy shared she believes the Tidewell Foundation's mission to provide perpetual support is vital for so many in our community. "Knowing first-hand the beauty and importance of what Tidewell provides to patients and families, I wanted to get involved to raise funds so families who did not have insurance or Medicare would be able to receive the charity care and free grief services for which Tidewell is known to so lovingly provide.

Steven J. Krause came to the Tidewell Foundation Board already knowing a bit about Tidewell and said he was inspired by "the opportunity to learn more about the breadth of how

Tidewell impacts our community, individuals, families – and it blew me away. I did not understand that breadth. When it comes to what we do for Veterans, Grief Support, Blue Butterfly – all these programs serve so many people in need, far beyond the traditional hospice services."

Steve particularly has a strong affinity for the power of healing of Tidewell's Grief Services and Blue Butterfly program. Having experience with a family member struggling with alcohol addiction, Steve found so much help when connecting with other people with similar shared experiences through Al-Anon. "When I think about grief support and Blue Butterfly programs, the participants are sharing with people who understand what you are going through. Sharing ideas of what worked for them. That is so powerful for healing."

Also Steve loves the fact that Tidewell has programs in place and was open to conversation to expand outreach to LGBTQ community. He shared, "I know there are people, especially older LGBTQ might be estranged from families or removed from community services they may need like hospice, grief support because they fear those providers lack the understanding of the modern day family. There are lots of nuances for modern families and Tidewell understands that so well, bringing comfort and care to all."

A native of Chicago, Steve serves as Senior Vice President, Senior Trust Advisor for Northern Trust's Wealth Management division. He has worked with Northern Trust for 42 years. Steve has been together with his husband 24 years, married in 2011 when legally able to do so, and the couple has been in Sarasota for nine years. Their three adult children are all married and Steve has a 4-year old grandson. Steve is looking forward to more grandchildren in the future...'he hopes'!

Steve notes, "with all that Tidewell does currently, there is more to do! Serving on the Foundation keeps the focus on how we expand the reach of all the great programs that Tidewell provides to families and communities, especially those traditionally underserved."

24 years old, spending two weeks along with his family at our Bradenton Hospice House. Everyone who knew and loved Chad knew how much he loved fishing. Just three days after surgery to treat glioblastoma brain cancer, he was on the water in Manatee County, doing what he loved.

Sadly, 17 months after being diagnosed with the disease, Chad passed away at just 24. His mother, Joann, moved by the care they experienced during his stay at the Tidewell Hospice House and the mission to extend this care to others free of charge, began the Chad Day Annual Fishing Tournament, benefitting the Tidewell Foundation, held at Tarpon Bay Grill and Tiki Bar in Sarasota, April 9th-11th. In addition to the fishing tournament, participants can enjoy a silent auction, raffles, and live music.
