Recent accomplishments of Tidewell Hospice and the Tidewell Foundation:

• Tidewell Hospice is one of only 30 hospices in the nation selected to partner with the American Heart Association and the National Hospice Partnership for Innovation to participate in a pilot of an advanced Cardiac Care patient program. The new program serves chronic and end stage cardiac patients providing home monitoring and care.

• The Tidewell Foundation announced a grant of \$1.1 million in donor support for Tidewell's first Family Grief Center. Opening in August in Ellenton, the center will provide a place for a holistic approach to mind, body and spirit for adult and children's grief from loss of a loved one. The Center is a prototype of several more to come in our region, through donor support.

• Tidewell Foundation, through a lead grant by the Charles and Margery Barancik Foundation, and supporting grant by the Community Foundation of Sarasota County, is launching the Tidewell Blue Butterfly program in Newtown Sarasota. Housed in the partner and site host - Bethlehem Bible Church this program brings free grief support to children and families in the Newtown Sarasota area.

• Through grants from the Tidewell Foundation, Tidewell Hospice recently hired its third music therapist, providing much needed connection and support to patients and families.

• Tidewell partnered with the NAACP, Unidos Now and many local churches in Sarasota and Bradenton to provide COVID-19 vaccination clinics serving Latinx and African American community members.

• Treasures Sarasota, the second resale shop supporting the Tidewell Foundation, opens in the Palmer Crossing Plaza on Clark Road at Honore in mid-September. Volunteers are needed. For more information go to tidewellfoundation.org

• And, of course, our big news that Stratum Health (the not-for-profit parent company of Tidewell Hospice and the Tidewell Foundation) completed its merger with Empath Health, a not-for-profit hospice system based in Pinellas County. The new not-forprofit merged parent company takes the Empath Health name.

When Hershel Workman moved to Port Charlotte from Indiana in April, he vowed to take Donna, his wife of 30 years, to the beach. Donna, a retired office manager and the mother of three adult children, has dementia and is a Tidewell Hospice patient. Though

The upward mobility in such a high growth industry will allow participants to easily advance their careers, while bringing home a livable income. Tidewell Hospice provides paid training and a career ladder supporting participants in moving from home health aide, to CNA, LPN, RN and more.

The events provided a brief ceremony and an opportunity to gather to honor the loss of a loved one, friend, caregiver, coworker or even the loss of a beloved pet or change in life status. The ceremonies began with music played as guests arrived, followed by the program. Guests had the name of a loved one read aloud.

Community celebration of life events were held Sarasota and Charlotte counties. The Bradenton celebration of life ceremony was cancelled due to inclement weather. Tidewell Family Grief Center Ellenton



The Tidewell Family Grief Center in Ellenton is a first-of-its-kind facility in our region that will provide holistic grief support for individuals, families and the community.

The Tidewell Foundation is currently seeking additional donor support to complete the Center's outdoor interactive activity area. This multi-purpose green space will include a labyrinth, basketball court, butterfly gardens and other features that will create experiences essential to the healing of mind, body and spirit for children and adults after losing a loved one.

Tidewell Family Grief Center clients will have access to opportunities to meet their own grief needs, whether through one-on-one sessions, groups, art therapy, meditation, or alternative therapies. It will also create space for a new expansion of Tidewell's Blue Butterfly program, the region's only evidencebased grief program for children ages 5-18 and families who have experienced the loss of a parent, sibling or another significant person in their lives. Tidewell Hospice plans to open the Tidewell Family Grief Center's doors to the community in August 2021 with the start of the 2021-2022 school year. The Ellenton location will serve as a pilot for future Tidewell Family Grief Centers across the region, and the Tidewell Foundation welcomes donations to help make them a reality.

Tidewell Hospice's grief services help people through some of their darkest days as they seek to find light and healing. 100 percent donor supported through contributions to the Tidewell Foundation, these services are offered for free to members of our community.

U.S. COVID-19 Cases and Deaths at New Lows, But Vaccination Rate Slows

At this time last year, public health officials were perplexed by the fact that despite having only 4 percent of the world's population, the U.S. was experiencing 20 percent of COVID-19 cases and deaths. Now, as cases fall in the U.S., the pandemic has intensified in other countries, with more virus deaths reported in 2021 so far than during all of 2020. "Everyone has a role to play in ending this pandemic. Getting vaccinated is the single most important thing you can do now to help save lives, get things back to normal, and end this crisis. 96% of practicing physicians have been vaccinated, and I strongly urge everyone who hasn't yet received the vaccine to go out and get it. It's free, it's very safe, and it works".
